Software gets better when many people use it, improves the code, debug it, fix errors and discuss further development goals.


Most of the Open Source software is coded by paid people (FSF, IBM, Novell, RedHat, Cygnus, Troll Tech ... OpenCMS;=).

Economics of attention ("Ökonomie der Aufmerksamkeit")




Tons of projects, tools, utilities and stuff: sourceforge.org 230.000 projects (Feb. '09)

- Keeping contact to the community




Obstacles in using Open Software

- "Not invented here" syndrom
- Hard to use and small documented
- No security of investment
- Doesn't fit in the technical 'cultur' of the organisation
- No knowledge and tools to evaluate the fitting of the OS solution

Perspective of Open Source
